

Monthly Commentary

In May, Delaware's labor force participation (LFP) rate grew by 0.1 percentage point to 59.0%, the first over-the-month rate increase in the twentyfive-month period since April 2023. May's rate, however, was 3.4 percentage points lower than the US LFP rate of 62.4% and 0.7 percentage points lower than Delaware's May 2024 LFP rate of 59.7%. The total number of workers in Delaware's labor force grew by 800, the largest over-the-month increase since June 2023 and 900 more workers than a year ago. Based on Current Population Survey data, workers reentering the labor force made up nearly half the total number of unemployed workers in May, up from one-third in April, and likely also drove this month's increase in labor force participation.

Delaware Labor Force Trends

Delaware's seasonally adjusted unemployment rate in May 2025 was 4.0%, up from 3.9% in April 2025. There were 20,100 unemployed Delawareans in May 2025 compared to 19,100 in May 2024. The US unemployment rate was 4.2% in May 2025, unchanged from April 2025. In May 2024, the US unemployment rate was 4.0%, while Delaware's rate was 3.8%.

In May 2025, seasonally adjusted nonfarm employment was 494,100, unchanged from April 2025. Since May 2024, Delaware's total nonfarm jobs have increased by a net gain of 5,300, a rise of 1.1%. Nationally, jobs during that period also increased by 1.1%.


